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Wednesday, 4 and Thursday, 5 April 1917

The Day we Left New Zealand.

Reveille. 4.am Breakfast

5 am. Roll Call. 8am

marched to the train, from the train to the Troopship, (Devon)

went right on board, left the

Warf[sic] at 1 PM. Went out a

Short distance into the stream, & dropped anchor for

the night, left again. about 5 am

& sailed, south east, & has been doing the same since

Friday, 6 and Saturday, 7 April 1917

Good Friday At Sea. Lifted anchor about 5 am & sailed away south east sea very calm not many sick quite well myself. We have drill twice a day For about - 1 hour, own bunks are Hammocks hung from the ceiling. Good for not making us sick as they swing with the boat. The bunks hang over the tables, & get to be taken down. through the day – blankets & then rolled. up together & put way in racks No Hot Cross Buns

At Sea

Sea as calm as a mill pond & looks lovely. Nothing but sea for miles around saw a whale today passing about ½ mile away. A concert was held amidships. tonight. By the course of the ship now we are making towards S America Lat 47 7 9 16 owing to us going so far South, we a gain a day what they call Antipodes day. We were unit[?] for duty today. Sports were held on board today, some very amusing events.

Sunday, 8 and Monday, 9 April 1917

Easter Sunday At Sea Was at church service in the morning. In the afternoon we were at Bible Class

Physical & Drill, & Signalling, as usual, Still going About South East With a fine sea

Tuesday, 10 April and Wednesday, 11 April 1917

At Sea Same as, usual Weather getting cold Drill & Signalling saw another whale Boat Drill, Raft No 4

At Sea

Our Platoon went on for guard Today. 2 hours on, 4 hours off. I was on first. round 10 to 12, then 12 - 4 to 6 - 10 - 12 - 4 - 6, we had all the next day off & we slept in the clink. Raining slightly. during the night. Weather getting very cold. Jessie Birthday [words are boxed] April 11 1917

Thursday, 12 and Friday, 13 April 1917

At Sea On Guard Business explained on previous page, slept most of the day. Very Cold night still making South East. Started mess ordlies[sic] duty today carry on for a week Weather 40 degrees

At Sea

Weather 38 Degrees The morning broke very rough raining & blowing, some, sea getting a bit rough now. breaking over the lower decks our hatchway was closed down this morning. very cold Drilling with great Coats on, Kit inspecting this afternoon Weather improved a good deal this afternoon We all have bad colds.

Saturday, 14 and Sunday, 15 April 1917

At Sea Weather still very Rough Mess ordilies[sic] still Boat Drill. Payed today 10/-Boxing Contest afternoon very good Sea getting very rough Temp 34

Temp 32 Weather very Rough High Sea Running all day. Several showers of snow getting near the pole I guess / Mess Orderlies again. very rough job too, seen several Dishes[?] of Potatos & Sausages. scattered About deck. Church in troop deck at 10 am Bible class afternoon 30 Present Rev 1 Chapter

Monday, 16 and Tuesday, 17 April 1917

At Sea Weather improving big swell still Running / D Coy unit for Duty. Mess ordilies[sic] still. Got good praise from Cpt Potter, O.C. for the conditions of mess untensils[sic] Lecture afternoon re parts of Rifle Cleaning & so on, Men wanted of working coal. had a try but was too late 2/- day extra [words underlined].

At Sea Weather fine Still Mess Ordlie [sic] Nothing much doing today.

Wednesday, 18 and Thursday, 19 April 1917

At Sea

Weather broke stormy & got worse through the day by time it came night it was very wild, very big swell, on, felt a bit sick. Got good praise from the Dr for the way we had our dishes Finished up Mess orderlil[sic]

Weather still Rough Lecture all day nothing startling Posted a letter to Jessie

Friday, 20 and Saturday, 21 April 1917

At Sea Started to work in. coal bunker shifting coal. 2/- a day extra. not a bad job Keeps you warm Weather improving sailing N. E. Passed Cape Horn this morning

All Lights out at night At Sea Still at the coal finished for the day at ½ 11. Afternoon, the Boxing was finished the Gold Medal was won by Prvt Mackie A Company. Several heats with the lazy stick were pulled off to be finished on Wed A Concert was held in the evening in Lower Troop Deck

Sunday, 22 and Monday, 23 April 1917

At Sea. Weather improving still travelling North East Mess ordilies[sic] for coal lumpers table Church Service 10-am & 7 pm Bible Class [word crossed out] 2.30 till 3.30 pm 1 Revelations. 32 Present wrote letter to Anna

At Sea

Weather better, At the coal again The rest platoon Physical drill & lecture. Very cold & stormy tonight

Tuesday, 24 and Friday, 25 April 1917

Still at Sea [underlined]. Weather fairly good but cold. Still working at the coal. Nothing exciting. Had a fine dinner today grilled chops the best I have had since I left home.

At Sea Weather very cold, Anzac Day. whole holiday Services & speeches from ten to 11 During the speech we came in sight of an ice berg they reckon it was about 3 miles off. The gunman had a shot but it fell very short. Sports afternoon blind fold boxing & lazy stick. Saw about 50 more icebergs, the afternoon & passed very close to some at night A good concert at night

B Shaw & Fairmaid[?] beat Meek & Mee at 5.00pm

Thursday, 26 and Friday, 27 April 1917

At Sea Weather cold, but clear in morning heavy rain this afternoon Working coal. All day. Had Grilled steak for dinner

At Sea, Weather fair. still working coal vaccination today. came down from the hold to get down & then straight back Got paid also £1-0, got our Identification disc.

Saturday, 28 and Sunday, 29 April 1917

At Sea, Weather fair, Still at coal Sports this afternoon was not there. Writing letters. Send letters to Sophia Bella Johnny, Geo Marshall[?] Brighton Choir. to catch mail at Capetown Finished work on Coal

At sea

Weather very good best day yet. Church Service this morning, / Communion afterwards was there, Bible Class this afternoon. 32 Present Wrote a letter to Jessie & Mother. Church at 7 Pm was not. there travelling East,

Monday, 30 April and Tuesday, 1 May 1917

At Sea Weather Good . Drill very light on account of vaccination Wrote a letter to Mother & Jessie

At Sea Weather Good Did not go Duck shooting. On Guard 10 to 12 Shift. slept out on Deck

Wednesday, 2 and Thursday, 3 May 1917

At Sea

Weather very good finished guard at 8 oclock. Armed Guard put on at 6 A.M. Had to wear Lifebelts all day Boat alarm. Sea very calm Lovely sunset. Medical Inspection.

At Sea & Port, Weather foggy morning had to stop & blow the whistle. Met the first, vessel on the journey. about 8 Am, fog lifted. & saw another steamer, & then between 8 & 9 we sighted land. Cape Colony the Tableland appeared to be up in the clouds. The Harbour tug. met us & guided us into the harbour Corinthic, in 2 hrs ahead of us We were not allowed off on account of some soldiers trouble out from capetown. We berthed at About 12 oClock. They started to coal with about 100 Niggers

Friday, 4 and Saturday, 5 May 1917

In Harbour Capetown. Weather very wet in the morning, broke away fine about 10 OClock. Went for a route march for a few miles. around the town, back again for dinner. General leave granted to all troops except of 20 of 15 Platoon D Coy, for fatigue, & I was among the unlucky ones we did not get off till 6 oclock. we took cabs up to the town & then, had a look around & a big tea & went to the pictures

Bought Kodak £2 - 4/ In Port Capetown Weather again wet morning lovely after 10 OClock was Marched through the city to the Band Rotunda, & then dismissed for the day. Had a good look round everywhere lovely gardens. Dinner Y.M.C.A. Long Street. afternoon went the round trip by Tramcar to Camp Bays a lovely place rose up 700ft above sea level. passed the Table mountains. on the way Had a swim & cup of tea All free Took some snaps. Went to Pictures Walked home to boat

Sunday, 6 and Monday, 7 May 1917

Capetown. Weather fine Left the wharf about 7 A.M. & anchored out in the stream. D Coy for Duty, did not get anything to do. Church Parade at 10 o'clock Did not get ashore. Had a couple of hours sleep in the afternoon Went to church at night.

In the Stream Good day nothing doing.

In the bay. Good Day.

Starting Physical Drill Practising for Sports

In the bay. good day. Throat getting better. Physical Drill Signalling. Practical. Practice for football game & Potato race Slept on Deck

Thursday, 10 and Friday, 11 May 1917

Fine day. In the bay till 12 oclock & then we lifted anchor & set sail for England, with 8 other troopships all lights out at nights. Sailing three deep. Practicing for sports again & signalling

Sailing North

At Sea Fine Day weather getting hot. DCoy unit for Duty. Went to Dentist, to get impression taken. Did a big washing[underlined] today that all started our choir Slept on Deck

Got paid for coalwork 14/- 7 days

Saturday, 12 and Sunday, 13 May 1917

At Sea. Weather very hot. awnings put up for shelter. Semaphore signalling, till 10-30. Medical Inspection got my teeth fitted Afternoon Sports.

Passing football D Coy 15 Platoon lost their heat. Potato race won my heat by default.

Broad Jump Meek beaten Bible reading. Concert at night Slept out on Deck Sailing North

At Sea Weather getting hotter Church Parade at 9-30 AM on the aft deck, & was singing in Choir.

Bible Class afternoon Revelation 2 Chap. Church 7 OClock Slept on Deck

Monday, 14 and Tuesday, 15 May 1917

At Sea Weather still hot. Washing day for, 15 Platoon. Washed Pants & Coat

Wednesday, 16 May and Thursday, 17 May 1917

At Sea Weather very hot Started Mess Ordlie[sic] J Elder & One 15 Platoon on. Guard a lot of sickness aboard feeling quite well myself. Reading a good book On the Edge of Beyond, by Gertrude Page

At Sea

Weather still very hot Losing a lot of sweat A Private. tried by Court Martial & got 42 days for stealing a pair of puttees. All the troops were lined up. & he was stood up in front of them when getting his sentence.

Sailing north Slept on Deck found my mate to be Joe Simmonds who used to live at Taieri Beach[?]

Friday, 18 and Saturday, 19 May 1917

Very hot at Sea Mess ordlies[sic]. Rained at night very heavy everyone caught out on deck

Got my false teeth

very hot at Sea Mess Ordlies[sic] Lecture on discipline Nothing doing afternoon

Sunday, 20 and Monday, 21 May 1917

Church Parade 9-30

At Sea

very hot. Crossing the line Cruiser away a head to cut the wires. Father Neptune came aboard at 2 Pm with his full crowd. the best. time I have put in on the ship. They tipped every one into the water they could get hold of. Capts. Doctors Lieut[?] & privates Slept on Deck

Tuesday, 22 and Wednesday, 23 May 1917

At Sea Weather very hot & muggy Sighted land at daybreak. came to anchor in bay at about 9.30 Am. The name of the district is Sierra Leone, & the chief town Freetown. 1 hours drill in morning rest[underlined] of day off. Lecture on tying up wounds Went on Guard at. 3 relief

Thursday, 24 and Friday, 25 May 1917

In Bay Weather very hot coaling all day with natives Officers went ashore. On Guard till. 6 Pm. one of my eyes very sore not allowed to sleep on deck

In Bay

Weather very hot Private Mapp. E Coy dropped dead at his post on Guard Body taken ashore & Buried. firing party & Band went ashore with them. at Doctor with eye. very sore today.

Saturday, 26 and Sunday, 27 May 1917

Weather very hot Left Sierra Leone at. 10 oclock No more escort. At Dr With eye very sore this morning better afternoon. Jack Houston took some Photos for me of Sierra Leone. did some writing to Jessie afternoon & had a sleep slept on Deck. Travelling West

At Sea

Weather Hot Church Parade I am at the Dr with eye very sore. Victor & me name[?] taken for sitting on cases of potatoes know our fate tomorrow At Bible Class afternoon Rev chtr 2-8-10 Sgt Halford held Prpbt [Presbyterian?] Service a[sic] 6oclock. **English Church service** 7 oclock, was at neither slept on Deck Travelling N[?] West by North

Monday, 28 and Tuesday, 29 May 1917

At Sea Weather not so warm. Up before O.C. (first time) for sitting on Potatoes. 3 days C B at Dr. eye getting better. Changed a pound, On Parade afternoon name taken for lighting a match forward of Bridge. Slept on Deck At Sea

Met a strange boat 6-Am this morning had, cruiser did a few rounds about her to see whither bound, D Coy Guard & Fatigue I had ½ hour work for the day. Read & played cards the rest of the day & chased the Bugle 4 times

Wednesday, 30 and Thursday, 31 May 1917

At Sea, Weather good. Kit inspection in the forenoon. Met a Sailing ship, this morning

Slept on Deck

Weather Good

At Sea Chased the Bugle four times & finished up.

Started on the coal. afternoon at 3/- per extra.

Washing in the morning

Slept on Deck

Friday, 1 and Saturday, 2 June 1917

At Sea Weather Good getting cooler Working at coal all day. Boat drill 10.30.

Slept on Deck

At Sea Weather. good Cold wind Working at Coal half day Sports afternoon lost my heat potato race. Great Wrestlying[sic] match Pascoe G Coy versus Mattson G Coy. Pascoe Won Great fun. Pillow fight over sheet Water. Best concert yet held. All dressed as Pierroits[sic]. Slept on Deck

Sunday, 3 and Monday, 4 June 1917

At Sea. Weather good. (cool) Church Parade 9-0am. Sermon on 13 Chap Revelation. Communion 10-am was there, Did not go to Bible Class Wrote letters to Jessie & Maggie Church 5.45 Srgt Halford Preaching. At bit of a riot on board over the Butter buried[?] the Butter. Had to sound the alarm to break the men up Slept on Deck

At Sea

Weather & cool shower of rain Working Coal. Prvt Vezey [Vesey] Court Martialed for stealing a comrades money Belt got 42 days dedention[sic] & 3 [?] out of 4 days tied to the railing. Bought a writing pad 6d – Slept on deck

Tuesday, 5 and Wednesday, 6 June 2014

Weather cold At Sea. Working Coal.

Met a cruiser & another boat about 10-30 Am, L Corporal. Mason Lost his stripe & [?] C B for swearing at Corpl McGuigan

Sea getting rough Slept on Deck

Met two Ships

At Sea. Weather cold Working Coal forenoon Sports afternoon Enter for all events

won none,

Steering gear went

Thursday, 7 and Friday, 8 June 1917

At Sea Weather good Cold Wind. Lost our job on Coal through going to Sports. Washing close[struck out] clothes Morning. Vaccination inspected. afternoon & Physical Drill Going on Guard 6-Pm Third Relief Slept on Deck

At Sea

Weather Good on Guard all day 8 to 10 & 2 to 4 hours A Coy Sports. Between 37 ½ past we sighted the escort 10 Torpedo Destroyers moving at full speed. It a fine sight, the troopships all fell into single file. The destroyers are all round us took 2 snaps of them Slept on Deck

Saturday, 9 and Sunday, 10 June 1917

At Sea

Weather Good. No Drill today Orders full marching order, boots & Buttons shined up. Getting near to old England Kits to be packed. Medical Inspection First [word crossed out] aid material given to every man Books of the Library given away, Destroyers cutting about every where. Got paid for Coal Slept on Deck

At Sea

Weather Good. Went for Dry Rations Sighted England about 9-oclock. seen first Aeroplane about 9-15am Passed Eddystone Lighthouse in view of England. Arrived at Devonport 12 oclock. Passed Plymouth Hoe at the Wharf 4 oclock A beautiful view & scenery on the way in. Pulled into harbour take off gold, went out again into the stream., A Submarine was sunk just a little in front of us this morning.

Monday, 11 and Tuesday, 12 June 1917

In Stream Weather Good Up at 5 am. got our kits on Deck ready to leave the old Devon while waiting a seaplane passed over the ship & came down in the bay. Came off the old Devon onto a lighter. At halfpast nine brought to the wharf & put on a train for Sling Camp We passed some of the loveliest country & scenery I ever saw. The paddocks are all wee squares with hawthorn hedges arrived at Sling Station at 6 oclock. Marched to the Camp, about a mile the Camp is badly laid out saw about a dozen Aeroplanes fling[sic] over us Went to bed about 10 oclock Very tired.

Sling Camp Reveille at 6 oclock A Shower bath, before breakfast Parade for equipment Medical parade Dental Parade Inspection Parade Dinner. Review of heads Lecture by Major, Smoke Kit inspection They shake you up some

Wednesday, 13 and Thursday, 14 June 1917

At Sling Camp Weather Good Went out to drill at 10-30 Signal Drill [word crossed out] & Mills Web Equipment put together & inspected till 12-oclock. Afternoon Route March & pulling[?] arms a bath & finished up for the day.

As you were [underlined] At Sling Camp Weather hot Prayers & Inspection Signal & drill. Physical Drill Bayonet Fighting Heads right, 12 oclock afternoon, Lecture on Gases Lecture on Wire entanglements Lecture on Lewis gun into lines March back finished 4-30

Friday, 15 and Saturday, 16 June 1917

At Sling Camp Weather very hot Prayers & Inspection Practice with P.H. Gas Helmets 1 hour Practice putting up wire fence 1 hour Practice with Lewis gun March Past 12oclock Bayonet Fighting Squad drill. Bomb throwing home 4-30

At Sling Camp Weather very hot Prayers & Inspection 1 hr Squad drill 1 hr Bayonet fighting 1 hr Bomb throwing March past 12 oclock 1 hr Gas Helmets, 1 hr Fencing 1 hr Lewis Gun 4-30 home

Aeroplane came down close by both men killed

Sunday, 17 and Monday, 18 June 1917

Sling Camp Weather very hot 88 degr

Church Parade 9-Am

Went for a Walk. had a look at Aeroplane had tea Y.M.C.A.

Sling Camp Weather rain Bull Ring as usual

Lecture up till 8pm

Tuesday, 19 and Wednesday, 20 June 1917

Sling Camp Weather hot & Rain Bull Ring as usual

The Bull ring is the place Where you go through Squad Drill, Bayonet Fighting Bomb Throwing Gas Helmets Fencing Lewis Gun

Sling Camp Weather Cloudy Bull Ring as usual,

at Y.M.C.A had poached eggs

Thursday, 21 and Friday, 22 June 1917

At Sling Camp Bull as usual Finished Bull.

Raining afternoon

The 23rds Left for - France – about midnight [underlined]

At Sling Camp Weather Cold & Morning showery Throwing live Bombs Classed B Im [crossed out] in the March Past [underlined] Afternoon Cleaning [Clearing?] out huts Evening Y M C A. Cup of Tea & Strawberries

Saturday, 23 and Sunday, 24 June 1917

At Sling Camp Weather cold Went through Gas chamber with P.H. Helmets on.

Squad Drill.

afternoon washing & Bath.

at a [word crossed out] Concert Y.M.C.A. very good. Supper Y.M.C.A.

At Sling Camp Weather Dull Church Parade 9-am[underlined]

Monday, 25 and Tuesday, 26 June 1917
